

Who Will I be this Lent?

When we hear the story of the Publican and the Pharisee It appears to be black and white. There is a hero, and there is a villain, a "good guy" and a "bad guy". But who are we, "am I, more like the Publican or the Pharisee?" Am I humble before God and man, like the Publican, or am I boastful and proud before my brothers and sisters like the Pharisee? Do I try and hide myself and my nakedness before God, or do I show myself to Him and cry out for His mercy?

When we hear this parable our gut reaction is to say to ourselves that we want to be like the Publican. We hope to be humble before God. We all want mercy. We all want to speak to God in prayer properly, to know Him, to be truly sorry for our sins, to cry out to our Lord for mercy, and to leave the temple justified; just like the Publican did. This is how we see, or at least want to see ourselves; but if we just leave it there and don't dig any deeper, we do ourselves a great injustice and risk never knowing our God who loves us more than we can ever know.

The reality is that we take on the characteristics of both the Publican and the Pharisee. All too often, when we do the right thing, we become so prideful that we forget that the glory is not our own but is due to God alone. This is when we act just like the Pharisee. He thanks God for *making him so special*, and not in humble recognition that all good things come from God.

We also live the sinful life of the Publican, but all too often, unlike the Publican, we forget to fall down before Christ with tears of repentance and seek our Lord's abundant and steadfast mercy and forgiveness. Instead of taking on the negative characteristics of the Pharisee and the Publican, we are called to take on the very best of both men.

So who will I be? Both! We are called to take on the piety and devotion of the Pharisee along with the humility, awareness of our sins, and repentance of the Publican. This is what our Lenten journey, as well as the pilgrimage of our whole life is all about. To become who God created us to be. To be transfigured. To become like Christ. To love God and honor Him with our devotion like the Pharisee,

and with a humble and contrite heart like the Publican.

As we prepare for our Lenten journey, the Church reminds us to take on the very best of both the Publican and the Pharisee. This is why we hear this parable each year as the Church leads us into the Lenten season. So that our devotion to God be done in all humility, for Him and through Him. May God be with us and show us his mercy this Lenten Season!



Schedule a Confession. Every morning say, "Today I will be humble." Use up/freeze meats this week.

Pray facing East this week. Christ is returning from the East and we wait for Him! Use up/freeze dairy this week.

Ask each other for forgiveness each evening this week before bed.

> Bring an icon to church for a procession.

Bring a prayer rope to be blessed today! Use it and pray the Jesus Prayer each day this week.

Wear your cross to church and kiss the cross each morning with a bow!

Every time you climb stairs this week ask St. John to help you reach Paradise with the sign of the cross!

> Ask the Theotokos to offer you and the world pure thoughts and ideas this week.

> > Place your palm branches and pussywillows behind an icon at home and in your car!

Refrain from TV, Internet & Phones to honor Christ's Death.

Greet everyone with "CHRIST IS RISEN!" & say it before good morning and goodnight!




- The week after the Sunday of the Publican and the Pharisee is a FAST FREE week.
