



**The Sunday of the Myrrh-Bearing Women** Today on the 3rd Sunday of Pascha, the Church honors and remembers the faithfulness of the Myrrhbearing Women. Last week we remembered St. Thomas and and heard about him and the other Apostles, who while hiding in the upper room encountered Christ risen from the dead. While the Apostles hid in fear, the Myrrh bearers, the faithful women who stood at the foot our Lord's Cross, lovingly and courageously went to the Tomb of Christ to properly care for the Holy Body of their Lord.

Among these brave and faithful women were Mary the Mother of God, Mary Magdalene; Mary, the wife of Clopas; Joanna, the wife of Chouza; Salome, the mother of the sons of Zebedee; Mary and Martha, the sisters of Lazarus; and Susanna. As for the rest, the scriptures are silent, but the fearless devotion of these women is truly an awe inspiring testament of faith.

The Myrrh Bearers are remembered throughout the ages because of the faith, love, and care they showed to Christ. The question we should all ask ourselves is "How can I be more like them? How can I care for the Body of Christ?" We are like the Myrrhbearers when we are good stewards to the Church. But what does that mean? Stewards are caretakers, people who lovingly and passionately care for something, just like the Myrrhbearers care for Christ. So then, the better question is how do we care for and love Christ's Body, the Church?

There are so many wonderful and meaningful opportunities to do this. Just think of all the important ways that we care for Christ's Body by caring for His Church. In the Church, we are the members of Christ's Body, and so we also care for our Lord's Body by caring for one another. Right now, from your own homes you can be a myrrh bearer simply by loving your neighbor as yourself and praying for them. The time will come again when we have limitless ways to be myrrhbearers. A time when we can work again, side by side for the glory of our Lord. Today we can work side by side in an even more meaningful way by loving and forgiving one another.

St. Paul tells us that Christ is the Head of the Church, and that the Church is His Body. We are the Church and that very body, and so when we love one another as Christ loves all of us, then we care for the Body of Christ in a real way, just like the Myrrh-Bearers.

Who were the Myrrh-Bearing Women?

**Mary Magdalene** purchased myrrh and spices to anoint the body of the buried Christ, and to accord Him, following Jewish custom as much honor as possible. This role is fitting for her since two of the Evangelists place her among the several women, and third identifies her as performing this noble deed herself.

Mary the Theotokos (Mother of God) is the Mother of the Word and God Jesus Christ. It is assumed by the Church that she was present with the other women bearing myrrh.

Joanna is the wife of Chouza, the steward-administrator of King Herod Antipas and was also one of the women who first witnessed the Resurrection.

Mary was the wife of Cleopas (the brother of Joseph), the making this Mary the aunt of Jesus and sister-in-law to the Theotokos.


**Susannah** is the wealthy woman of the group who provided material means of support to the ministry of Jesus Christ during his three-year public ministry.

**Salome** is the generally considered to be the wife of Zebedee, and mother of the Apostles James and John. She who asked the Lord to have her sons sit one on His right, and the other on His left.

Mary of Bethany is the sister of Lazarus. She was a believer even before Jesus raised her brother from the dead and continued to be a faithful servant of God long after the Ascension of Jesus into heaven.

**Martha of Bethany** is the other sister of Lazarus. She was also a believer in Jesus Christ before He raised her brother Lazarus from the dead. It is generally assumed that both she and her sister were present as the news of the Resurrection of Christ was announced to the world.
