


We Need Protection...

Today we celebrate the Feast Day of the Protection, or the Patronage of the Mother of God. Following the ancient tradition of the Church, we continually cry out to the Mother of God to hear our prayers and to intercede for us with her Divine Son Jesus Christ; we ask Mary, who is always near her Son to pray to Him for us.

This is what happened in the middle of the tenth century when the Mother of God protected the city of Constantinople from destruction.

On Sunday, October 1, during the All Night Vigil, when the church was overflowing with those at prayer, the Fool-for-Christ Saint Andrew, at the fourth hour, lifted up his eyes towards the heavens and beheld our most Holy Lady Theotokos coming through the air,

resplendent with heavenly light and surrounded by an assembly of the Saints. Saint John the Baptist and the holy Apostle John the Theologian accompanied the Queen of Heaven. On bended knees the Most Holy Virgin tearfully prayed for Christians for a long time. Then, coming near the Bishop's Throne, she continued her prayer.



The Ever-Blessed Mother of God implored the Lord Jesus Christ to accept the prayers of all the people calling on His Most Holy Name, and to respond speedily to her intercession, "O Heavenly King, accept all those who pray to You and call on my name for help. Do not let them go away from my icon unheard." (from oca.org)

We are always in need of protection. Sometimes it's from an army of soldiers, sometimes it may be a disease, or sometimes from inclement weather, but we always, ALWAYS we need protection from sin and from the memory of sin and the hopelessness that comes with it. Mary shows us how to trust God just like she does. She reminds us that God's promises are always true and that just as God forgives us when we repent, we need to be able to forgive ourselves as well.


This is how the Mother of God protects us. She prays for us and she shows us that we are capable of by the grace of God of becoming holy people of God, like our Father in Heaven created us to be. Mary points the way to Christ and guides us to Him, protecting us from sin by her prayers.

On the Feast of the Protection we sing "Today the Virgin stands in the midst of the Church, and with choirs of Saints she invisibly prays to God for us." Just like she knelt in the Church in Constantinople on the Feast of the Protection and prayed for the people as the city was under siege, she is with us today and every day that we ask for her intercession; praying for us and for the world

The army of demons and of sin is always knocking at the gates of our souls, trying to corrupt us; trying to destroy us and pull us into the same isolation and misery that they experience. But Christ is always near us and with us, and his mother is always protecting us by pointing us to Him.

We ask the Birthgiver of God to Remember us in her prayers, "that we may not perish by our sins". We ask her to protect us from every evil by showing us the Light. The Theotokos guides us to Christ by her example. Mary loves her Son and shows us how to do the same.

We show that we love Christ by hearing His word and becoming like him. By loving our enemies. By doing good and hoping for nothing in return. By forgiving even those who are unforgiving to us. By being thankful for all that our Heavenly Father has blessed us with. By being merciful as God is merciful. We show that we love Christ when we take up our cross and follow the example of the Mother of God.



We Come to You for Protection O Most Blessed Virgin!

You are like the divinely planted Paradise, O Theotokos, the place where the Tree of Life was watered by the Holy Spirit. We acknowledge that you gave birth to the Creator of all Who feeds the faithful with the Bread of Life. Together with the Forerunner, entreat Him on our behalf; and by your precious omophorion protect your people from all attacks!


