

Communion with the Saints: One Church United in the Living Christ

When we think about the concept of the Church, we often envision its physical buildings. The Orthodox Christian world is filled with beautiful Temple's dedicated to the glory and majesty of God. We might also think of the people, the gatherings of faithful believers coming together to worship Christ and partake in the Eucharistic. St. Paul reminds us that the Church is not just a structure; it is the very Body of Christ, and we are its members. However, the Church is not confined to this earthly realm alone. It is Universal and One, just as Christ Himself is One. This unity in Christ transcends death itself, making us a part of the same body of the living Christ, whether we are breathing the



air of this world or have passed into the next.

The Church on Earth and in Heaven: The Church on Earth is often referred to as the Church Militant because, while we reside on the physical Earth that we call home, we engage in a constant struggle against sin, evil, the devil, and his demons. This ongoing battle mirrors the spiritual warfare that began when Adam and Eve succumbed to temptation in the Garden of Eden.

In the Church Militant, we have all the tools that we need accept the gift of Salvation offered to us by Christ and through His Incarnation. Our earthly journey is marked by a commitment to prayer, diligent preparation, sincere repentance, disciplined fasting, offering forgiveness, having empathy, and a daily willingness to take up our cross. Through prayer, we communicate with God, seeking guidance, strength, friendship, and communion with God. We prepare ourselves through spiritual education, deepening our understanding of faith, daily reading of the Scriptures, and fortifying our spiritual armor. Repentance serves as a constant process of self-examination and reconciliation with God, allowing us to grow in holiness. Fasting, both as a spiritual discipline and an act of self-denial, helps us detach from worldly distractions and focus on the Eternal. Daily, we strive to follow the path of Christ, embracing our crosses, and living out our faith through participation in the Sacraments and active engagement in the vibrant life of the Church, as we find our vocation to serve the Church and journey together toward Salvation.

On the other hand, the Church in Paradise, known as the Church Triumphant, is where the Saints reside. The Saints and Martyrs of the Church have successfully fought the good fight, completed their earthly race, became like Christ, and now enjoy their eternal reward and rest in Heaven. It is essential to understand that the Church Militant and the Church Triumphant are not two separate entities; they are one Church, united in prayer and communion with the One Living Christ.

The Communion of Saints in the *Divine Liturgy:* The Communion with the Saints and the Church Triumphant is most vividly experienced during the Divine Liturgy, the central worship service in Orthodox Tradition. At the beginning of the Divine Liturgy, as the Royal Doors are opened, believers enter into a "time outside of time," stepping into God's heavenly realm. Just as Heaven met Earth in the Incarnation of Christ, a profound meeting of Heaven and Earth occurs during every Divine Liturgy.



In this sacred moment, the Church Militant, consisting of the living members of the Church, is truly united with the Church Triumphant—the Saints and the Angels. This union is what we refer to as the "Communion of the Saints" In this spiritual communion, the Church remains one, and its members are united and supported in Christ through prayer and worship of the Holy Trinity.

Praying for One Another: This communion between the living and the departed is not confined to the Divine Liturgy but is a continuous reality in the life of the Church. Believers pray for the departed, just as they ask the saints to intercede on their behalf. This intercessory prayer is akin to the way we ask our friends and loved ones to pray for us during our earthly lives. In Christ, this prayerful unity transcends the limitations of physical life, connecting believers across the boundaries of time and space.

Veneration of Icons and Relics: In the Orthodox Church, the veneration of icons and relics of the saints is a significant aspect of this communion with the saints. In the early Christian Church, the celebration of the Eucharist often took place at the graves of martyrs because these believers knew that they and their departed brothers and sisters in Christ were still united in worship, just as they had been in life.


This union transcends space and time and endures eternally. Even the bones of the saints and martyrs radiate with the uncreated grace of God, as their souls rest in peace, working miracles even after their deaths. This ancient tradition, embraced by the early Christians, remains an integral part of Orthodox tradition today.

In the same way when we attend a funeral, we are invited to venerate the body of the deceased as an Icon, a temple of the Holy Spirit made in the image and likeness of God.

In the Orthodox Church, worship is centered on the Holy Trinity, but it also purposefully honors the saints. The saints are not distant figures but a part of the great cloud of witnesses, surrounding and supporting the Church both on Earth and in Heaven. They serve as examples, showing the way to be like Christ and enduring to the end. As believers, we pray to be saved as they are saved, understanding that our Communion with the Saints is an unbroken continuation of the rich traditions passed down by the Holy Apostles and Fathers of the Church.




